15,000+ Road To Recovery[®] volunteers provided cancer patients more than 188,000 rides to and from treatment.

Our Hope Lodge[®] program provided 267,000 nights of free lodging to cancer patients and caregivers who traveled far from home for treatment. Volunteers help make their stay convenient and comfortable.

Volunteers for our nonprofit, nonpartisan advocacy affiliate – the American Cancer Society Cancer Action NetworkSM (ACS CAN) – advocate to ensure public officials at all levels make cancer a priority.

Nearly 150,000 petitions were delivered to Congress through the One Degree campaign, helping to restore \$2 billion in cancer research funding to the federal budget.
