

Study Enrollment

VOICES enrollment began in May 2024.

- You are among the more than 4,000 women who are already enrolled!
- To maximize the study's potential of better understanding how cancer impacts Black women and find ways to improve health outcomes, we need more women to sign up.
- Many of you have shared that you heard about the study and decided to join because a friend or family member asked. Now we are asking you to help us add to our community by sharing the study with your family and friends who are eligible.

Have you submitted your VOICES survey?

If you recently joined the VOICES study and signed the consent form, you must also complete the Life and Health history survey to be **fully enrolled** in the study. This comprehensive survey provides our researchers with extremely valuable information about your medical history and lifestyle. The purpose of the VOICES study is to better understand cancer and other health conditions among Black women, and these data are captured through the questions included in your surveys.

Please remember that the value and accuracy of the study depend on high response rates to the surveys.

Your Life and Health history survey can be found in your participant portal along with all other study-related surveys. Please log in to your portal to complete any needed surveys and/or confirm that you have no open tasks. We sincerely appreciate the time and effort you devote to this study. VOICES Spotlight

As co-principal investigators, along with our colleagues, we recently published the **VOICES** concept paper, where we share why VOICES is such an important and impactful study.

Community Highlights

- · ACS is partnering with service organizations, HBCUs, Black women researchers, faith-based partners and more to reach communities nationwide.
- We are also partnering with sports organizations such as the WNBA and media partners like the Oprah Winfrey Network (OWN) to support recruitment!
- Over 500 volunteer ambassadors have been trained to promote the VOICES study, build trust, and provide ongoing community feedback.

New VOICES Substudy

In addition to completing surveys about your life and health history, VOICES participants will be periodically invited to sign up for substudies to collect additional information or a biospecimen. The **optional VOICES Blood Substudy**, which involves providing a small sample of blood is **now open** and participants are invited approximately 3 months after completion of the baseline Life and Health History survey.

Over 550 VOICES participants have opted in to this substudy. Thank you to everyone who has already participated in this important research. To learn more about the **optional** VOICES Blood Substudy, please visit here.

Please note that while you have the option to provide a biospecimen for the study, VOICES of Black Women is **not** a clinical trial or experiment. Researchers will not ask participants to take pills or medication, change their lifestyle, or receive treatments of any kind. All VOICES substudies are optional, and you will **still be enrolled** in VOICES if you decline participation in a substudy.

VOICES Data Privacy and Security

The American Cancer Society (ACS) is the largest nonprofit funder of cancer research outside of the US federal government, and solely funds the creation and ongoing maintenance of our population studies.

- VOICES of Black Women is funded by ACS and run by our Population Science department.
- We prioritize data **security and privacy** to ensure the long-term success of our study and to maintain the privacy of our participants.
- The Emory University Institutional Review Board oversees and monitors all ACS study activities.
